Vocabulary	Definitions
circumflex (n)	to <b>bend</b> around or curve
deflect (v)	to turn or move to one side; to <b>bend</b> ; to swerve
flexible (adj)	capable of <b>bending</b> without breaking
flexor (n)	a muscle that <b>bends</b> a part of the body, such as an arm or a leg
inflection (n)	the <b>bending</b> of a person's voice so that it does not sound boring or within only one tone; making one's voice go up and down
inflexible (adj)	not capable of being <b>bent</b> without breaking
reflect (v)	to <b>bend</b> or throw back light or heat; to fold or turn back
reflection (n)	the image in a mirror that is a result of <b>bending</b> light when it is thrown back
reflex angle (n)	an angle that is greater than 180 degrees because the angle is <b>bent</b> beyond the straight line
retroflex (adj)	<b>bent</b> or turned backward

fractals (n)	the type of geometry that creates <b>broken</b> patterns out of a smaller version of a design
fraction (n)	a part of a whole; a <b>broken</b> piece of something that is no longer whole
fracture (n)	a <b>break</b> in a part of the body
fragile (adj)	so delicate that it could <b>break</b> easily; easily damaged
fragment (n)	an incomplete sentence; a <b>break</b> in a sentence
fragmented (adj)	describes something that is <b>broken</b> into pieces
frail (adj)	being easily <b>broken</b> or destroyed
infraction (n)	a <b>broken</b> rule; a violation
refract (v)	to bend light so that it looks like it is <b>broken</b>
suffrage (v)	to <b>break</b> into an issue; to vote
